

George Cameron

..... played eleven Reserve Grade games with Wests in 1926. He played another eleven Reserve Grade games in 1927, but it was also the year that he made his First Grade debut. It was George Cameron's only appearance in the top Grade. He went on and played another seven Reserve Grade games in 1928 but this brought George Cameron's Grade rugby league career to a close.

George returned to the Fairfield A Grade team in the Southern Districts junior rugby league competition in 1929 and 1930. A news report in the Biz newspaper noted that George Cameron had been injured in a football match at Granville and was hospitalised. his injury was not as serious as first thought, but no further record has been found of George playing rugby league after that date.

By the early 1930's George had moved to the nearby suburb of Merrylands where he lived most of his life. He later moved to Jerseyville near Smithtown on the NSW north coast. A report in the Biz newspaper noted that George had recently been visited at Jerseyville by his brother Roy and that, "the two brothers will be remembered by many as among the greatest of rugby league footballers produced in the Fairfield district." That was high praise and attests to George's rugby league ability as
