Frank Boyd

...... was graded with Wests in 1927 and played eight Third Grade games in his first year in Sydney football. In 1928 he made his First Grade debut, but it wasn't until the following year that he had the opportunity to play two more First Grade games with Wests. Frank was a fullback and like many other good fullbacks Wests had in the 1920's and early 1930's, they were up against Frank McMillan who was a Wests institution. Like many others, Frank Boyd had to bide his time.

Frank Boyd was with Wests from 1927 until 1930 and during his time at Wests, he played three First Grade, fifteen Reserve Grade and twenty five Third Grade games. Frank Boyd played no Grade rugby league after 1930, however he did play for Granville and Southern Districts in the Southern Districts Junior competition in 1932. He then played for Group 2 in the Metropolitan Competition in 1933, as Granville were one of three teams excluded from the Southern Districts competition that year.

Frank Boyd was a versatile rugby league player who could play in a number of positions and was a good goal kicker. In all grades, Frank scored seventeen tries and kicked fifteen goals for a tally of eighty one points.

Frank Boyd lived the later part of his life in the inner suburbs of Sydney and died at Newtown, NSW in February 1987.
