Match Description

Glebe — Full-back, R. Algie; three-quarters, R. Moroney, M. Muggivan, C. Davis, Davidson; halves, C. McKivat, Ladner; forwards, A. Burdon, S. Griffiths, J. Moroney, S. Pert, E. Swinson, Jones.

Western Suburbs — Full-back, Slingsby; three-quarters. Mantle, Alderson, M'Fayden, Medcalf, halves, Naylor, Brandt; forwards, Barclay, Perry, Johns, Mead. Doyle, Briscoe. **Referee, Mr. Laurie Kearney.**

There were about 300 spectators present when Glebe kicked off against the wind. Almost immediately after R. Moroney kicked a goal from a mark. Glebe 2, Western Suburbs nil. Even play followed, until Glebe attacked, and were awarded a free kick in a good position from which Moroney kicked his second goal. Glebe 4, Western Suburbs nil. Glebe returned to the attack, and, Ladner securing near the 25, passed to Davidson, who was forced out in the corner. Glebe continued to press, and, Davis picking up in the ruck, passed to Pert, who scored. R. Moroney converted. Glebe 9, Western Suburbs nil. A few minutes later Muggivan picked up, passed to Davidson, who scored. R. Moroney failed at goal. Glebe 12, Western Suburbs nil. A little later McKivat picked up, ran strongly, and passed to R. Moroney, who crossed. The same player converted. Glebe 17, Western Suburbs, nil. Medcalf next kicked a penalty goal for Wests. Glebe 17, Western Suburbs 2. These were the half-time scores. In the second half Glebe had an easy task, and eventually won by 35 points to 15. For Glebe four tries were added by Muggivan, and Faunce kicked three goals. Naylor (2) and Perry scored tries for Wests, and twice Medcalf put the ball over. **(Evening News August 13th 1910)**

Glebe beat Western Suburbs by 35 points (tries by Pert, Davidson (2), R Moroney, Muggivan (3), and 4 goals by R Moroney and 3 goals by Faunce) to 15 points (tries by Naylor (2) and S Perry, and 3 goals by Medcalf) at Wentworth Park. L Kearney referee.

SMH account has try scorers as Pert (1), Davidson (1), R Moroney (1), Muggivan (4) contradicting The Referee - this seems the more accurate as it also agrees with the Evening News account

Notes: The Evening News had a Brandt playing at half but this seems an error. James Ogilvie was listed in other accounts as playing and setting up one of Naylor's tries and he played in the preceding games and the following game in Round 11. Tommy Faunce was credited with kicking 3 goals for Glebe in all accounts but was not in any team list so obviously came on as a reserve. The Johns listed in the Wests' pack is only credited with one game and seems to be Thomas "Tim" Johns, likely another example of a junior being called up, or a Rugby Union ring-in. Similarly, Edwin James Slingsby was listed in all published team lists. He only played one game in all grades.
