#### **Match Description**

Eastern Suburbs - full-back, King; three-quarters, D Frawley, J Campbell, Griffiths, S Bruce; halves, Dalton, Cody; forwards, R Williams, P White, M Frawley, S Pearce, Green, Kelly

**Western Suburbs** - full-back, Medcalf; three-quarters, Ogilvie, Feeney, Patterson, Alderson; halves, Naylor, Scott; forwards, Barclay, Perry, McDonald, Mead, Elliott, Scott, Maulle, Shaw. **Referee, Mr W Finegan** 

Frawley kicked off against a light breeze. A splendid passing rush by Easts ended in Codey being forced out on Wests' line. From the scrum Cody again secured and crossed. Frawley landed the goal. Eastern Suburbs 5, Western Suburbs nil.

In play, Wests looked like scoring, but lost the ball. Campbell then secured, and after a good run passed to Cody, who crossed between the posts. Frawley again added the extras. Eastern Suburbs 10, Western Suburbs nil. The Easterners now had matters their own way. Campbell and D Frawley (2) added tries and the latter landed two goals and Griffiths one. At half time the scores were; Eastern Suburbs 25, Western Suburbs nil. In the second half, M Frawley scored two tries and Campbell one, one of which was converted by M Frawley and one by Dalton. Naylor and McFayden scored tries for Western Suburbs, and Medcalf kicked one goal. The final scores were; Eastern Suburbs 38, Western Suburbs 8. (Evening News 20th August 1910)

... Ogilvie (who is the runner who lost the 100 yards NSW Amateur Championship on protest) was the soundest player for Western Suburbs, who, however, are not up to First Grade strength. It is a pity they cannot secure the services of a few more players of experience, as there is some excellent raw material in their ranks. (Referee 24th August 1910)

...Wests hadn't the ghost of a chance against Easts, who were evidently under instructions to get two tries each or none at all; so, Cody, Campbell and the two Frawleys got a pair each.

It is up to Wests' officials to duck around this summer and get together a side for next season that will give the other clubs a decent go for it. (Sydney Sportsman 24th August 1910)

**Notes:** There is considerable conflicting information about this match. Two papers had a Scott playing half-back and listed 8 forwards, including Scott again! and Maulle for Wests. Claude McFayden was not listed in any paper except the <u>Sunday Sun</u> yet he scored a try!! McFayden played in Round 10 and played in the next game in Round 12. It seems highly likely that he played at half in this game, although further research indicates that Gilbert Scott likely came on as a replacement. Ogilvie is noted as being a 100yd sprinter who lost the NSW Amateur Championship on protest. D McDonald and George Paterson are rewarded with First Grade games after numerous Second Grade appearances. George Paterson is sometimes spelt in records as G Patterson and did appear in early lists with a double 't'. However, a 1917 Archive team photo has him as G Paterson (now President of the Club). This was also the first appearance for Horace Alderson.
