Western Suburbs Captain Colin Maxwell, bruised his right shoulder during the match and had it in a sling later. When Stanmore initiated the two best tries of the game (scored by Horder and Wall) just before half-time, Wests, to run with the wind on resuming, was expected to take control. First of these tries came when Stanmore picked up from the loose and weaved through the Norths defence to send Horder over. A few minutes later an attempt at goal by Middleton struck the upright. Stanmore gathered and sprinted down the left flank, sent to Wall, who kicked and regained to score. West led 15-5 at half-time. Interest revived when Dickerson scored after a great run by Middleton and Middleton added two goals shortly after resuming. Each side scored three tries in the second half, but, as Keato piled up his goals, the game slipped away from North Sydney. Holman and Stanmore made good moves and winger Wall ran resolutely in the Wests' back line. McLean and Williams worked hard in the forwards. .... **(The Sun 14th August 1949)**

**Notes:** Peter McLean was back from injury in time for the semis but Colin Maxwell aggravated an old shoulder injury. Jack Wall had a timely powerful game on the wing but the limelight was stolen by Bill Keato who kicked 10 goals from 15 attempts to take the game away from Norths. Kevin Hansen played well again and clinched the Daily Telegraph Best and Fairest Award where he won a free return trip to England. It was well deserved; he had been noted as the best forward on the field in the majority of Wests' games for the season.
