### Match Description

**Western Suburbs** - Full-back, Medcalf; three-quarters, Wellings, Halling, McFayden, Naylor; half-backs, Bolt, Feeney; forwards, Doyle, Jarvis, Abercrombie, Perry, Palmer, Mead

**Glebe** - Full-back, R Algie, three-quarters, S Lynch, J J Hickey, R Moloney, A Wright; halves, C Davis, C McKivat; forwards, E Swinson, A Burdon, S Griffiths, S Pert, J Moroney and W Hardcastle. **Referee Mr George Seabrook**

Abercrombie kicked off for Western Suburbs. Soon after Bolt passed to Naylor, who lost the ball after crossing the line. Glebe pressed, but a good kick by Wellings relieved. At half-way Naylor obtained possession, and ran in. Medcalf kicked a fairly easy goal. Western Suburbs 5, Glebe nil. Glebe rushed the ball to Wests' line, where a free was given against the latter, and Hickey landed an easy goal. Western Suburbs 5, Glebe 2. A fine passing rush was started at half-way by McKivat, and it ended in Moroney scoring between the posts. Hickey added the extra points. Glebe 7, Western Suburbs 5. Glebe forced the pace, and from a scramble on the line Pert struggled over and scored. Hickey again kicked the goal. Glebe 12, Western Suburbs 5. Shortly after Swinson secured, passed to Griffiths, to Pert, who crossed the line. Hickey added the extras. Glebe 17, Western Suburbs 5. The half-time whistle then sounded.

On resuming, Western Suburbs forced the game, and at half-way Medcalf obtained a free, from which he kicked a goal. Glebe 17, Western Suburbs 7. From just on the 25, McKivat obtained possession, and passed to Moroney and Lynch who scored. Hickey added the goal. Glebe 22, Western Suburbs 7. Just before time Naylor secured at half-way, passed to Feeney to Wellings, back to Feeney, who scored in the corner. Medcalf's kick was a failure. The fulltime whistle went, the scores being Glebe 22, Western Suburbs 10. **(Evening News 28th May 1910).**

Glebe beat Western Suburbs by 22 points (tries by J Moroney, Pert (2) and Lynch and 6 goals by Hickey) to 12 (tries by Naylor and Feeney and 3 goals by Medcalf) at St Luke's Park, Concord. Mr G Seabrook, referee.

Glebe - Full-back, R Algie, three-quarters, S Lynch, J J Hickey, R Moloney, A Wright; five-eighth, C Davis half-back, C McKivat (c) forwards, E Swinson, A Burdon, S Griffiths, S Pert, J Moroney and W Hardcastle.

Western Suburbs - Full-back, W Medcalf; three-quarters, E. Wellings, A Halling, C McFayden, H Naylor; half-back, P Bolt(c), J .Feeney, five-eighth; forwards, T Doyle, V Jarvis, J Abercrombie, S Perry, E Palmer, E Mead **(Referee 1st June 1910)**

The game did not start until nearly 4 pm and the **Sydney Morning Herald** reported "...It is unfair to the public who pay to see these matches that the game should be finished in the dark, besides being highly dangerous to the players. The league should do its best to enforce punctuality." **(SMH 30th May 1910)**

**Notes:** This was yet another game which started late, prompting criticism as listed above. Official records have the score for this game as 22 points to 12 but this is based on one reference from The Referee. However, five other reports have Medcalf only kicking two goals (a penalty and a conversion) and the score being 22 points to 10, with Medcalf missing the conversion of Feeney's try. Albert Halling played another match after being in Second Grade, while there is definite evidence that Fred Grinsted had a game as a starter and not Verner Jarvis
