### Match Description

**North Sydney**- Full-back, Maher; three-quarters, Pakere, Matterson, Ferguson, Bollard: halves, Warne, McFarlane: forwards, Courtney, Byrne, Boland, Sullivan, Dunlop, Muller

**Western Suburbs** - Full-back, Medcalf; three-quarters, Gormley, McFayden, Feeney, Mantle: halves, Bolt, Naylor: forwards, Elliott, Doyle, Mead, Luhr, Perry, Palmer **Referee: Mr George Seabrook**

Mead kicked off for Wests. The ball bounced out in Norths' 25 but their forwards soon transferred play to centre, where play took place for some considerable time. Bolt secured from a scrum in Norths' 25, and passed to Naylor who lost the ball on the line. A free kick to Norths enabled them to clear their line. Uninteresting play followed. Gormley injured his knee and retired, Keen taking his place. Norths now pressed but could not break through Wests' defence. From close play at half-way Bolt passed to Naylor, who kicked across the Northern line, and following up fast beat the opposing back, and scored near the posts. Medcalf added the extra points. Western Suburbs 5, North Sydney nil. At half-time the scores were unchanged. Shortly after resuming Bolt picked up at Norths' 25, passed to Mead, who cut in, and scored. Medcalf failed at goal. Western Suburbs 8, North Sydney nil. Soon after Pakere, from half-way, passed to Courtney, who scored. McFarlane converted. Western Suburbs 8, North Sydney 5.

After a spell of uninteresting play Medcalf - from half-way - kicked, and following up, again secured, passed to Feeney, to McFayden who crossed in the corner. Medcalf added the extra points. Western 13, North Sydney 5. Norths now commenced to liven up. McFarlane passed to Pakere to Matterson, who scored. McFarlane failed at goal. Western Suburbs 13, North Sydney 8 Just before time Bolt, in Norths' 25, picked up, passed to Boyle, to Mead, to McFayden, who crossed between the posts. Medcalf kicked an easy goal. Western Suburbs 18, North Sydney 8. These were the final scores. **(Evening News 16th July 1910).**

**Notes:** This was Wests only win for the season. Ray Gormley injured a knee in his only match of the season and apparently never played another match in any grade. He was replaced by Herbert Keen. The regular North Sydney backline of Broomham, Devereux, Morris and McCarthy was missing. Note the captain of Norths; Tedda Courtney! Luckily he came back in 1911 and played out his career with Wests.
