Match Description

Western Suburbs: Full-back, White; three-quarters, Collins, Gilbert, Burns, Vest; halves, McGowan, McPherson; forwards, Tye, Joass, Prentice, Easterbrook, Courtney, Redmond

South Sydney: Full-back, Hallett; three-quarters, Sheehan, Rowley, C Horder, H Horder; Halves, Anderson, Blair; forwards, Groves, Horne, Oxford, Davis, Holmes, Kerwick Referee: T McMahon

Western Suburbs kicked off against the breeze, and were soon travelling goal-wards. In the scrums they beat the premiers, in one of which, five yards from the line, Joass broke away and grounded the ball over the line. McPherson failed at goal and Wests led 3 to nil. Five minutes from the kick-out Western Suburbs' three-quarter line got moving. Gilbert, Burns and Vest handled the ball in turn. The latter was finally tackled by C Horder 10 yards from the line. From the scrum the ball travelled across the field to Courtney, who was laid out by a tackle and left the field. Reidy took his place. After a series of frees, South Sydney reached Western Suburbs ' 25, where from a penalty Oxford kicked a goal. Western Suburbs 3, South Sydney 2. ... Play was very willing, both sides taking some hard knocks. Wests still pressed, and McPherson picked up from a scramble on the line and then converted his try. Wests led by 8 to 2. From another free Oxford landed his second goal. Western Suburbs 8 to 4. Just on time Burns intercepted a South Sydney pass and toed the ball over the line. McPherson converted the try. Half-time scores: Western Suburbs 13, South Sydney 4.

In the second half, Western Suburbs continued to attack, and McGowan now showed his old club-mates how to get a side scoring. The ball came to him in Souths' 25. He passed out to White, to Gilbert, who ran straight, and put Collins in a good position to finish a fine movement with a try. McPherson failed from an easy position. Further points were registered by South Sydney, two points coming as a result of a goal. final scores: Western Suburbs 25, South Sydney 9 (The Sun 10th May 1919)

Notes: This was a big start for the season, smashing the last year's Premiers. The notable inclusion was the new half-back from Souths, George McGowan, He was playing opposite Wests in the important Round 12 loss in 1918 that cost Wests the premiership. Clarrie Tye also returned after two years at war as did Westley Easterbrook. Athol White continued to improve and played full-back for NSW twice during the year. Albert Johnston and William Palmer had both left to play with Newtown, although Wests were disputing Johnston's claim. The Seconds also had a big win against Souths with Alf Bossi as Captain and Hector Lee scoring a try as well. Joe Reidy was sent off after coming on as a reserve.
