Western Suburbs overcame a gallant but sloppy Western Reds outfit to post a slogging 22-8 victory at the WACA last night. Exciting centre Kevin McGuinness bagged two tries for the Magpies and was outstanding throughout. Veteran Paul Langmack also had a strong game for Wests, scoring one try and having a hand in most of the Magpies' best attacking moves. (The Sunday Telegraph 2nd June 1996)

Western Suburbs overcame a gallant but sloppy Western Reds outfit to post a slogging 22-8 victory at the WACA last night. Western Suburbs were under siege early in the second half and continually gave the Reds great scoring opportunities by coughing up possession. However, their defence was able to stand tall, and an intercept and 60 metre dash by Kevin McGuinness to score in the 59th minute split the game open. McGuinness sealed the Reds' fate with another converted try after pouncing on a knock-on. **(The Sun-Herald 2nd June 1996)**

A secret switch by coach Raudonikis proved a winner against the Western Reds on Saturday night. Raudonikis decided to bring specialist fullback Andrew Leeds back from injury in the centres, retaining the informed Ken McGuinness at fullback. Leeds came back from six weeks absence with a strong performance, while McGuinness was again all class at full back. The Magpies could persist with the positional switch in coming weeks, but won't be giving anything away. Coming games against South Sydney and the Gold Coast Chargers in the next two rounds have given the Magpies an excellent chance to consolidate their spot in the top eight. The Magpies can't afford to take either side lightly, but have the ability to win both games. Those four points would give the club a great platform for a late charge into the finals. Rookie prop John Skandalis gave another standout performance against the Reds. Following up his memorable debut against Penrith a fortnight ago, Skandalis was again prominent. Reserve forward Darren Burns also added plenty of thrust to the team when he was thrown into the fray by Raudonikis. Both players will figure prominently in the crunch games that are ahead. McGuinness bounced back to form with a two-try performance on the wing against the Reds. The display was a timely confidence boost for the younger McGuinness brother who started the year in great form before dropping a notch. He is arguably the Magpies' key attacker. **(Big League 5th June 1996)**

Notes: This was a slogging win which featured lots of dropped ball. Wests were able to get on top with an intercept 60m try by Kevin McGuinness and a second try to him from a dropped pass. Andrew Leeds came back in the centres, with the in-form Ken McGuinness retaining his spot at full-back. Darren Burns was powerful when he came on as a replacement and Paul Langmack had another scheming, strong performance.
