St George players remained unimpressed with themselves despite exorcising the ghost of Brookvale with a 32-16 win over Western Suburbs at Adelaide Oval last night. Saints disposed of the memory of last week's 61-0 hammering at the hands of Manly with six second half tries to keep their faint semi-final hopes flickering. Prop Jason Stevens was the star, sparking a touchdown avalanche when he laid the foundations for one and scored another five minutes later with Wests 4-2 up just after half time. Coach Brian Smith rated Nathan Brown "the most naturally gifted hooker I've had," after he set up three tries with deft dummy-half play. Western Suburbs led 4-0 early despite Saints' domination territorially, and there was no indication that Damien Chapman's 39th minute penalty goal for St George would turn the match. But Stevens grabbed a hitherto drab contest by the scruff of the neck when the teams returned for the second half. First, he steamrolled through the defensive line near half-way, off-loaded to fullback Rod Maybon who put replacement winger Anthony Mundine over in the corner. Then he became the first recipient of a Nathan Brown Special, taking the inside pass and plunging over after Brown had feigned a couple of steps to the right from dummy-half. ... Wests' crucial period came after fullback Andrew Leeds scored and converted to leave Saints just leading, 12-10, in the 58th minute. "I thought we had them in a bit of bother at 12-10," said coach Warren Ryan. Former Kiwi Test captain Stephen Kearney crossed for what he thought was a try not long after but referee Steve Clarke ruled Saints' stand-in skipper, Graeme Bradley and Brown held him up. "Then we put in a fairly feeble kick into their in-goal, they ran it out and ended up scoring," said Ryan. "We had our chances." A rib injury to Bradley was the only injury worry from a match which saved face in the second half after shaping up as a wasted evening for 12,874 South Australians in the first. **(Sydney Morning Herald 9th July 1994)**

Notes: Wests led 4-2 at half-time in a closely contested match. Even at the 58th minute they were only down 10-12 but the last twenty minutes was a series of errors that let Saints run away with the game. Stephen Kearney had a critical try disallowed which changed the course of the match. Saints were fired up after an embarrassing 61-0 loss to Manly the previous week.
