Cronulla winger Dean Carney will take up boxing during the off-season after contributing 16 points to the Sharks' 36-10 win over Wests at Ronson Field yesterday. But Carney, 23, has no intention of becoming a 'professional fighter' – he believes boxing can help him in his quest for a Kangaroo tour spot at the end of next season. "I think the greatest advantage to be gained from it is building up stamina from abetter functioning of the respiratory system," said Carney, a Wollongong beach inspector. "I'm going to approach Billy Mulholland, the brother of the professional boxer Wayne, for help and I'll work out on the punching bag at Wollongong Surf Club. Carney regained status as the season's leading point-scorer with his 16 points – a try and six goals from eight attempts. ...Gibson scrapped all plans to ease former Test star Steve Rogers back to first grade when the Sharks led 26-0 at half-time. "I had him on the bench until half-time," he said. "With the game locked up at that stage, I told him he could go and play cards. If it had been a tight game, I'd have used him." .. Wests' coach Ken Gentle admitted he thought his team was facing its worst defeat of the season at half-time. "The defence was terrible – there were too many soft tries – I couldn't believe we could be so inept," Gentle said. "If any good came out of the game it was 10-all score in the second half." Next weekend Wests play premiers Canterbury, who inflicted the worst defeat of the season – 52-0 – on them in the first round. "There's quite a few former Canterbury players here and they might be saving themselves," joked Gentle. An early setback did not upset Cronulla's rhythm. Cronulla five-eighth Barry Russell was helped from the field with concussion in the 15th minute after colliding with Wests' captain Lee Crooks. Mark Ellison switched from the second row to take over Russell's spot with Cronulla leading 6-0. He had a particularly good match, setting up tries for captain David Hatch and winger Phil Hurst. ....
