Western Suburbs left the bottom of the Rugby League competition ladder with a 33-4 win over a depleted South Sydney side at Lidcombe Oval yesterday. The Magpies scored seven tries to nil with captain and half-back Tom Raudonikis prominent in four. Souths were without key players prop Herb Timms and winger Geoff Hisletude and then lost full-back Greg Purcell in the opening minute and captain and second-rower Paul Sait at half-time. Following a great 16-14 win over Balmain last week, Souths were expected to give Wests a torrid time. But injuries and a staggering 18-9 scrum deficit were too much to overcome. With possession coming so freely from hooker Shane Day, the Wests' three-quarters had a field day. Centre Ron Giteau crossed for three tries and with three goals from seven attempts he finished with a personal tally of 15 points. Goal-kicking was a problem for Wests, and they used three kickers with varied success.
