Full-back Tony Ford yesterday kicked Western Suburbs to an 18-12 victory against Cronulla-Sutherland with six goals from nine attempts at Endeavour Field. Wests looked set for a runaway win when they led 14-2 five minutes into the second half. Cronulla came right back into the running in the 15th minute with a converted try by lock-forward Barry Reilly. Ford then kicked his sixth goal to give Wests a 16-7 lead. Ten minutes from the end it was anyone's game again when winger Ray Corcoran crossed between the posts for Cronulla and Barry Andrews landed his third goal. Cronulla then trailed by only 12-16. Ford's final goal six minutes from the end sealed the game for Wests.

In the second half Wests clearly showed the after-effects of Sunday's hard game against Manly. Gary Stewart finished 19-15 in front in the set scrums for Cronulla, but penalties favoured Wests 9-7. Tommy Bishop, the Cronulla coach, blamed bad handling and positional play for his side's defeat. Despite this, second-rower and skipper Ken Maddison had a strong game, gaining vital breaks and running with great determination. For Wests, nippy half-back Tom Raudonikis was unflagging in attack and always busy in cover defence. Second-rowers Barry Bryant and John Elford also had good games for Wests. Stephen Knight, the former Rugby Union international centre, had a quiet but efficient game. He paved the way for winger Don Rogers to score between the posts in the opening half. This was a much-needed win and put the season back on track.
