..... had a rapid rise from Third Grade to First Grade in 1933, but it was a difficult year for Wests with a high rotation of players. While Bill only played the one First Grade game that year, he did have further opportunities in the following seasons. Bill played until the end of 1936 and totalled twelve First Grade, forty Reserve Grade, and eight Third Grade games during his time at Wests, scoring a total of twelve tries in all games.



RLN 1935

In 1936 there was a move to establish a new First Grade Rugby League Club in the Parramatta district and the names of a number of prominent Western Suburbs players were nominated as likely candidates to join the new Club. Bill McLeod was one of these players along with Jim Parsons, Harry Hannan, Max Gray and Bob Allison. The proposal was rejected by the NSW Rugby League, and it would be another decade before Parramatta won the right to enter the Sydney competition.



The Biz 1936


Bill McLeod enlisted in September 1941 with the Citizens Military Forces at Merrylands, NSW for service in the Second World War. He then joined the AIF in March 1943 while in the field in Western Australia. He was posted to the 4th Infantry Battalion. Bill was discharged from service in February 1945 as he was required for employment in an essential occupation.

After he returned from military service, Bill furthered his business career. Bill's father and uncle were the Directors of ABBCO Bread Co during the war years and supplied baking products to Sydney as

well as the military. Bill McLeod took over the role as Manager of the company from his father in the mid 1940's after his father's death.

Bill McLeod lived the later part of his life in the inner city suburb of Leichhardt, NSW. He died in June 1986 at Arrawarra Headland, near the town of Woolgoolga on the NSW north coast, where he was born.
