Western Suburbs yesterday kept alive its Rugby League semi-final hopes with a convincing 22-5 win against Eastern Suburbs at the Sports Ground. Against a disjointed Easts' defence, Wests scored three converted second half tries after leading 7-0 at half-time. With Test hooker Kelly winning a big share of the ball, Wests continually stormed the Easts' line in the second half. Former international Peter Dimond and second-rower Jim Cody shone for Wests. Cody engineered many Wests' attacks with strong side-stepping bursts from the rucks. Dimond scored two clever tries. Only tireless cover defence by Easts' centre Ron Saddler stopped Wests scoring by an even greater margin. (Daily Telegraph 13th July 1964)

Western Suburbs played strongly to beat Eastern Suburbs 22-5 in the Rugby League match at the Sports Ground yesterday. Wests led 7-0 at half-time after running with the wind. They scored four tries and went close to scoring four more. Bob McGuinness and Noel Kelly failed to force the ball after diving over the line and two other players were hurtled into touch in goal. Wests outplayed Easts in the backs and in the forwards. Kelly showed fine leadership in keeping the ball moving among his players. ... Wests' forward Jim Cody led many breaks into Easts' territory. Easts centre Ron Saddler stopped many movements with glorious tackles. ... Wests have every reason to be pleased with their form in their late struggle to improve their position on the competition table. Kangaroo winger Peter Dimond scored two fine tries in a purposeful display. On the other wing, John Armstrong, a reserve grade centre, proved very difficult to stop. (The Sydney Morning Herald 13th July 1964)

Western Suburbs Rugby League players will go into special training quarters for a week if they gain a place in the final four. They will be accommodated on a big citrus property at Lower Portland. The players would live in three homestead buildings, and special diet and conditioning would be superintended by coach Jack Fitzgerald. Following Wests' defeat of Easts, 22-5, at the Sports Ground yesterday, the secretary Mr Bill Beaver, announced their big training plan. The players would see League films and their daily workouts on the property. Mr Beaver said that to gain a place in the final four, Wests would have to win six games in succession, or at least five games with some of the favoured teams being defeated by others not in the running. Notes: This was one of Wests' best wins so far in the season They completely outplayed Easts, with Peter Dimond and John Armstrong being dominant on the wings and Jim Cody leading the forward charges. John Armstrong had come in for the injured John Mowbray. Wests, at this stage, still had hopes of making the final four.
