George Skeers

..... was "a big lump of a lad", standing at 6ft tall and weighing 16 stone. When the Wests Committee saw him play, he put in his usual good honest performance. He was described as fairly fast for a forward of his size and he distributed the ball well.

He was invited to trial with Wests in the 1971 pre-season competition and though he was "raw" for city football, he proved to be a willing worker. He could handle himself in the scrums and provided support for his hooker.

In the open he was described as "hard running" and would be dangerous once inside the opposition's 25 yard line where he could use his size and speed to advantage.

George played his first game with Wests in the second pre-season Cup game in February 1971. He did well and followed with appearances in the remaining two Cup games.

George Skeers made a good impression on his first appearance with Wests' firsts, against Cronulla at Lidcombe. He worked well, in and out of the scrum, and was going strongly over the concluding stages.

He has the size — and Wests had been looking for a prop of weight and strength.

He made his First Grade premiership debut in round three against Penrith. It was also the same match in which Neville Sinclair made his First Grade premiership debut.

This match was also famous for the Peter Flanders incident, where Peter was allowed to leave the match early so that he could catch a train home to Coffs Harbour. The fallout from the incident went on for some time.

George played ten First Grade premiership games in 1971 but it was not a great year for Wests. The disruption to the team with constant injuries and the reshuffling of the playing roster halted any

momentum that Wests might have had. Nevertheless it was a good opportunity for George Skeers to develop as a player in a tough competition.

Wests brought in some new forwards for the 1972 season including John Walker (Easts) and John O'Bryan (Manly). Steve Winter and Russ Johnstone also remained with Wests, so there was plenty of competition for a front row spot. With limited opportunities, George played five First Grade games in 1972.

The 1973 season was George Skeers last with Wests. He didn't play a First Grade premiership match but was a regular member of Wests Reserve Grade team.

During his three seasons at Wests, George Skeers played fourteen First Grade, forty three Reserve Grade, six Third Grade and three Pre Season Cup games. He scored fourteen tries in all grades for a total of forty two points.
