

## **Russell Johnstone**

Round One Pre Season Cup Match 1966 – Paramatta v Manly Warringah

In 1967, Penrith was admitted into the Sydney premiership competition and Russ Johnstone returned home to play with his district club. His first match with Penrith was a pre-season Cup game where he came off the bench against his former club, Parramatta. Penrith had a narrow 6-5 win.

Russ made his First Grade debut with Penrith against Manly Warringah in round three of the 1967 season.


## Penrith Rugby League First Grade 1967

During his time with Penrith he played thirty four First Grade games and five Pre Season Cup games. His time at Penrith had its ups and downs. When he was playing well there was no one better but his form was inconsistent and with the effect of injuries he found himself in and out of Penrith's top team.

RUSSELL JOHNSTONE, Pen- rith's glant second row forward, seems to reserve his big days for the really major occasions.
One such was last Sunday's clash with Balmain. Penrith's Panthers wanted very much to win; and big Russ turned it on—a nonstop exhi- bition marked by strength and pur- pose.
Another such occasion was last year at Penrith when the Panthers also downed St. George.
If he could sustain that "big game" form Russ could be a power in League.
He is known as a player of "moods;" but it's a fact that injuries have cramped his career.
This year, for example, he missed several rounds, and in others he played lower grade. Last week's match was his first with the "seniors" for many weeks, and only his second this season.

RLN 17, 18 August 1968

He started the 1971 season with Penrith, playing one pre-season Cup game against St George then the following week, for the first round of the premiership competition, he was selected in Penrith's Third Grade team. In the Third Grade team were future First Grade players, Tim Sheens and Zac Olejarnik. It was the last game that Russ played for Penrith. On 9 May 1971, Russ played his first game with Wests.

Within a fortnight Russ was playing in Wests First Grade team. He made his First Grade debut with Wests on 23 May 1971. It wasn't Wests finest game as the Sydney Morning Herald reported the following day;

Wests have fallen to their lowest ebb in recent times and only five-eighth Tom Raudonikis and stand-in prop Russell Johnstone earned their appearance money. Raudonikis continually probed the defence, but support was almost non-existent. (SMH 24th May 1971)

Russ Johnstone's First Grade Debut with Wests – Round Nine 1971

Russ made an impression in this game and became a regular member of the First Grade team that year.

In 1972 he started the season playing the Wills Cup pre-season games and then was selected in the First Grade team or played off the bench in the first five rounds of the competition. He then played a number of lower grade games but did not see out the season.

Russ played his last season with Wests in 1973. He played five First Grade games, the last being recorded in round seven. There is no further record of him playing grade rugby league.

During his time at Wests, Russ Johnstone played twenty two First Grade, five Reserve Grade, one Third Grade, four Pre Season Cup and three Endeavour Cup games for a total of thirty five games. He scored seven tries in all grades for a total of twenty one points.
