The Jersey Flegg team of 1972 was arguably one of the best junior representative teams that Wests have ever fielded. In that squad, alongside Mick, were future First Grade players, Jim Myers, Trevor Reardon, Ron Giteau, Geoff Gardner, Steve Blyth and Steve Rigney.



The team went through the preliminary rounds and semi-final undefeated and faced South Sydney in the Final. In what proved to be a tough and at times brutal match, South Sydney won 15-5 on the back of a superior penalty count which they took advantage of through the goal kicking of John Berne. Wests scored the only try of the match.

Within a fortnight of the Jersey Flegg final being played, a number of the team were graded. Initially Jim Myers and Trevor Reardon were selected in Third Grade with Mick Liubinskas and Steve Rigney on the bench. This was a game against Manly at the Sydney Cricket Ground and therefore quite an experience for young players just out of the juniors. As Mick explained, he was somewhat star struck as he was called off the bench to play in this game. Mick's first game in a run on side was played on 6 August 1972 when he was selected in Wests Third Grade team to take on St George at Kogarah.

Mick played two games in Third Grade in 1972 and was rotated to the bench on several other occasions. At eighteen years of age, he was still developing but it was evident that he had a promising future, one that would endure eight seasons in Sydney premiership rugby league.

In 1973, Mick started out as a regular member of Wests Under 23 team before stepping up to Reserve Grade about half way through the season. In 1973 the Under 23's replaced the Third Grade competition.

Mick had a break out year in 1974. He had his initial taste of First Grade football off the bench in a round two match against North Sydney and then followed up three days later in an AMCO Cup match against a strong Eastern Suburbs team. He came into that team after John Elford pulled out the day before.

Mick had another run in First Grade from the bench in round six and then in round eleven, against Cronulla, he made his First Grade debut in a run-on side. It was a brilliant debut which stamped his credentials as a First Grade player and kept him in the First Grade team for the remainder of the year. The news reports from this match were glowing.

The Sun newspaper reported;

"Wests had eight men eligible to play in the Under-23 Grade, but they played their hearts out to set up what proved to be a match-winning 9-0 lead at half-time running against a strong southerly. Taking advantage of an early share of possession the Magpies put Cronulla under great pressure. Rookie prop Mick Liubinskas, one of Wests' best players, sent winger Russell Mullins over after 15 minutes. The decision of Wests' selectors to go for youth paid off. Liubinskas, Purcell, Hundy, all 21- year-olds, appear to be in first grade to stay."

The Daily Telegraph reported;

"Two promoted 20-year-old props, Mick Liubinskas and Pat Hundy, paved the way for Western Suburbs' shock 16-6 win over Cronulla at Lidcombe Oval. Their tough, non-stop play was cleverly directed by Kangaroo half Tom Raudonikis. Liubinskas and Hundy made the break for Wests' early tries."

The Wests Archive web site noted;


"Don Parish and the selectors put the broom through the team, with Satterly, Myers, Hundy, Raudonikis (back from rep duties) coming in and Ford, O'Grady, Foster and Rigney (suspended) out. Eight of the players were eligible for U23's. The return of Tom Raudonikis was significant. He played a blinder, leading from the front and was ably supported by Pat Hundy and particularly Mick Liubinskas who was outstanding in attack and defence."

Mick played all of the finals series games in 1974. Wests had wins over Souths and Manly in the preliminary minor semi-final and minor semi-final respectively but came up against a hot Eastern Suburbs team in the preliminary final. After a tight first half, Easts eventually wore down the Magpies to take out the match and ultimately the 1974 premiership.

Wests came up against a very good Easts team in the 1974 Final. Wests were down 2-3 at half time.

In 1975, Mick was caught up in a controversy not of his making. He started the year playing in the Wills Cup pre-season competition including the semi-final against Parramatta. He played in the First Grade team for the first half of the season but was out of the team during the month of June. In his second game back in a match against Canterbury, he came on as a replacement for Jim Murphy, scored a try and played well. The match ended in a 7-7 draw.

After the match Canterbury lodged a protest as Mick hadn't played a full Reserve Grade game as was required by the rules at that time. The protest was upheld and Wests lost the one competition point it gained from the drawn game.

The ramifications of the lost competition point played out at the end of the season when Wests finished on equal competition points with Parramatta and Balmain. Wests lost the play-off and therefore the chance to play in the semi-finals. Had the competition point not been lost then Wests would have been semi-finalists in 1975.

Mick brushed off the controversy and came back strongly in the next two rounds. The first of these games was a one point loss to Eastern suburbs which went on to win the 1975 premiership and the week after Wests had a very good win over Souths that consigned the Rabbitohs to a wooden spoon, the first time since 1962.

The Daily Telegraph reported;

"Wests, with four tries, had established a winning 20-3 break at half-time. Lanky second-rower Mick Liubinskas began their scoring with two early tries. Liubinskas intercepted a Bob McCarthy pass in the sixth minute to score unopposed near the posts. Liubinskas soon after was on the spot again in a 50-metre dash along the sideline which left Souths' Bob Grant and Eric Simms stranded."

This was the last First Grade game that Mick played in 1975. He had injured a knee earlier in the year and as a result of the injury to his knee in the Souths game he ended up with both cartilages removed.

In 1976, Mick was in the starting lineup for the Wills Cup competition and then played the first three games of the premiership off the bench. However injury once again took its toll, this time from a debilitating shoulder injury. It was a lengthy recovery process which saw him miss much of the 1976 season. He did come though and played six Under 23's games towards the back end of the season.

A strong start in 1977 saw Mick playing in the Wills Cup pre-season competition, an AMCO Cup match and First Grade up to round six. Injury once again affected his season and this time he was out of the First Grade team for two months.

He made his way back to the top team by round thirteen and was part of Wests charge to AMCO Cup glory. He played in the AMCO Cup quarter final win over St George and then from the bench in the semi-final against St George. That was the last game he played in 1977 thereby missing the opportunity to play in the AMCO Cup Final in which Wests defeated Easts 6-5.

The 1978 season again started with great promise. Mick played three pre-season Cup games, an AMCO Cup game, and the first two rounds of the premiership. In the round two premiership match which saw Wests defeat St George, Mick was once again in great form. The Wests Archive web site has recorded the following notes from that match.

"With Geoff Foster and Mick Liubinskas leading the way, the forwards were very dominant and the backs ran riot late in the game. Peter Rowles, again playing five-eighth, also had a blinder, and capped off a good game with a great late try and conversion from the sideline."

The game against St George came at some cost, as Mick suffered a painful shoulder injury. He was selected for the round three game against Penrith but succumbed to the injury and was a late withdrawal. He played again ten days later from the bench in an AMCO Cup game but the shoulder injury continued to hinder him. Recovery took some time but Mick eventually made his way back playing in Reserve Grade for the remainder of the season.

It was no doubt a frustrating year for Mick as Wests First Grade team were playing quite well with plenty of firepower in the forwards. The side was a settled combination that took out the minor premiership that year. Breaking back into the top team was never going to be easy under those circumstances.

It was his last year at Wests as in 1979 Mick decided to change his playing environment and hopefully remain injury free. He went across to rugby league neighbours, Balmain.

During his time at Wests, Mick Liubinskas played forty four First Grade, forty five Reserve Grade, two Third Grade, sixteen Under 23's, ten Pre Season Cup and five AMCO Cup games for a total of one hundred and twenty two games in all grades. He also scored twenty five tries in all grades for a tally of seventy five points.

Mick Liubinskas' Playing Record at Wests

Mick started afresh in 1979 with his new club, Balmain. He played in all of the pre-season Cup games which included a one point win over his former club, Wests, and a loss in the final of the Cup series to Eastern Suburbs.

Things were looking bright in 1979. Mick played in the round one premiership game against Easts which resulted in a 27-5 win and a reversal of the pre-season Cup final result.

He then lined up against Wests in the round two premiership game. He was only on the field for ten minutes when he suffered an injury that proved to be a season and ultimately a career defining moment.

Mick indicated that he smashed his good knee, which turned out to be a torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL). The ACL fundamentally holds bones and cartilage around the knee together and keeps everything stable.


Mick was operated on by Doctor Merv Cross who was one of the best in his field at the time, but the repair of the cruciate took months to heal and strengthen. The injury was another blow to Mick which would put him out of action for much of the season.

As he played little football in 1979, it was unlikely that Balmain would offer him a contract for the 1980 season. There is some irony in that it was his last First Grade game against Wests that ultimately brought his Sydney premiership career to an end.

In 1980 Mick had quite a number of offers to play Country football. There was a good opportunity at Lithgow but ultimately the coastal climate at Umina on the NSW Central Coast won out. Mick spent two years at Umina making the grand final in 1980.

Mick had not long married and while he was doing well in his employment with the national communications carrier, the PMG, he realised that he needed to advance his career and so he undertook further education and obtained an engineering degree in communications/information technology. Mick has subsequently built a successful career in the information technology sector.

However, Mick wasn't lost to rugby league. Tommy Raudonikis encouraged him to come out to Campbelltown to coach the Jersey Flegg representative team in 1995 and 1996. He then followed up by coaching the Wests Third Grade team in 1997.

Mick then coached the Wests Metropolitan Cup team in 2000. Additional funding was needed if the team was to be competitive in ongoing years but that was not forthcoming. That effectively closed Mick Liubinskas' coaching career.

He did continue as a selector for Wests junior representative teams between 2003 and 2009 but more of his time was taken up with the Wests Magpies Rugby League Board, The Wests Ashfield Board, and as committeeman and President of the Pratten Park Magpies.

In a tribute to Mick Liubinskas, he was selected in Wests Team of the 1970's as a Reserve along with fellow forwards Bruce Gibbs and John Baker. The pack chosen in the Team of the 1970's, included five internationals, and was comprised of Les Boyd, John Elford, Geoff Foster, Jim Murphy, John Donnelly and Ray Brown.

Mick was never selected in a senior representative team during his eight seasons playing in the Sydney rugby league premiership. There is no doubt that he was capable of competing at the highest level but his career was hampered by serious injuries at critical times. Each time momentum was building towards peak form, there seemed to be another setback.

The fact that he was selected in the Wests 1970's Team of the Decade alongside some of the great Wests players speaks volumes as to how well he was regarded as a football player and team mate.

These days Mick enjoys keeping fit with surfing and golf and is on hand to provide support and advice to some of the young up and coming players.
